

CHAPTER IV

Excavations in the Area of Mound E

Clarence B. Moore was the first to excavate in the Mound E area. During his 1905 expedition he tested (without result) the summit plateau of the mound (Moore 1905:188). The Alabama Museum of Natural History conducted extensive excavations to the north and east of Mound E during 1929, 1930, 1931 and 1932. The Museum also conducted smaller excavations to the northeast and south of Mound E, however, the exact locations of these two small excavations could not be determined from the field notes.

Excavation South of Mound E.

The only surviving information about what must have been a small exploratory excavation south of Mound E is the caption on a photograph. This photograph reproduced here as figure IV-1, shows a pottery ladle which was numbered 2SE. The caption on the photograph describes it as a shell tempered ladle, 4.4 inches in diameter, and 2.7 inches high. The length of the handle (or spout) is given as 1.9 inches. No other information except this

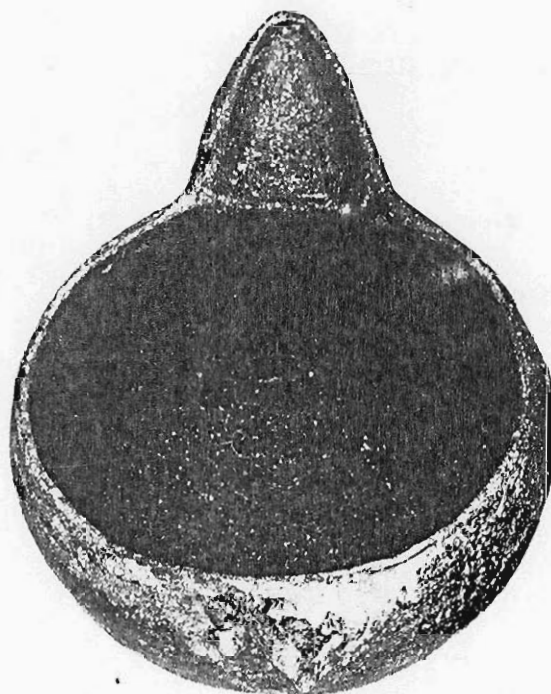
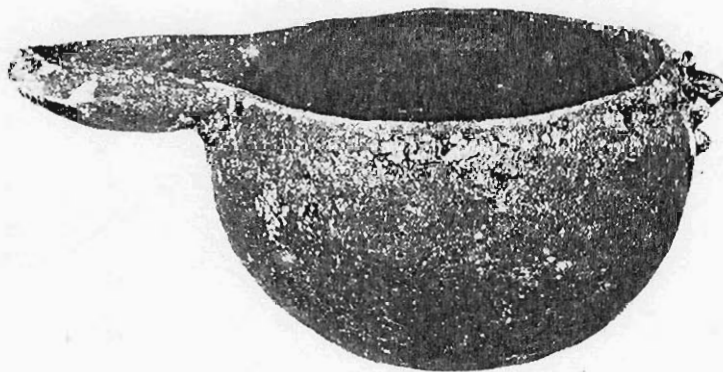


Figure IV-1. Moundville Black Filmed ladle, 2SE.

caption has survived from the excavation south of Mound E.

Excavation Northeast of Mound E.

During 1930 or 1931 an area was tested between the excavation north of Mound E and the excavation east of Mound E. Although no site map was made for this area, records were made for four burials and one artifact.

Burials NEE1170 and NEE1171 represented a multiple burial of one adult and one adolescent. The adolescent (NEE1171) was extended on its back with its head oriented to the northwest. This burial was found 62 inches below the surface and was slightly below and to the left of burial NEE1170. Burial NEE1170, an adult, was found 48 inches below the surface. The head of burial NEE1170 was also oriented to the northwest. No artifacts could be unequivocally associated with either burial. The remains of an aoriginally disturbed burial (NEE1173) were found between burials NEE1170 and NEE1171. A fourth burial, numbered NEE1172 was found "near the edge of the bank [the slope northeast of Mound E] . . . 30 inches below the surface."—This adult burial was extended on its back— with its head to the southwest. There were no artifacts associated with it.

An obsidian projectile point was discovered in the general digging northeast of Mound E. This "well made" projectile point was 4.5 inches long and was "polished."

Excavations North of Mound E.

In late 1929 and early 1930, in January and February 1932, and again in March 1932 the Alabama Museum of Natural History field crew under the direction of David and James DeJarnette excavated large areas to the north of Mound E. Figure IV-2 illustrates the extent of the area excavated. These excavations extended from the northern base of the mound down and almost to the base of the slope in back of the mound. Thus, as a result of these excavations the area north of Mound E has been almost totally excavated.

I was unable to locate the original field notes for the earliest (1929-1930) excavations north of Mound E. However, E. H. Chapman had summarized these notes during his tenure at Mound State Monument and I have used his summary here.

Like many of the earlier excavations at Moundville, the burials from the 1929-1930 excavation were not recorded in their own right. Burials were only recorded when they were accompanied by artifacts. Furthermore,

the burials which were recorded from the 1929-1930 excavation north of Mound E were not numbered in accordance with the unified numbering system for the site. Therefore, of the more than 94 burials excavated only 19 were recorded in the field notes and in Chapman's summary. These 19 burials were:

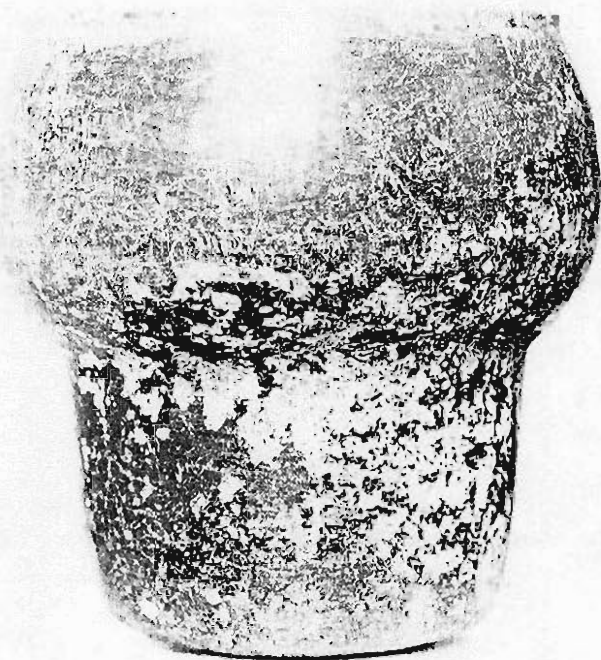


Figure IV-3. Atypical bowl, partially covered with white pigment, 129NE.

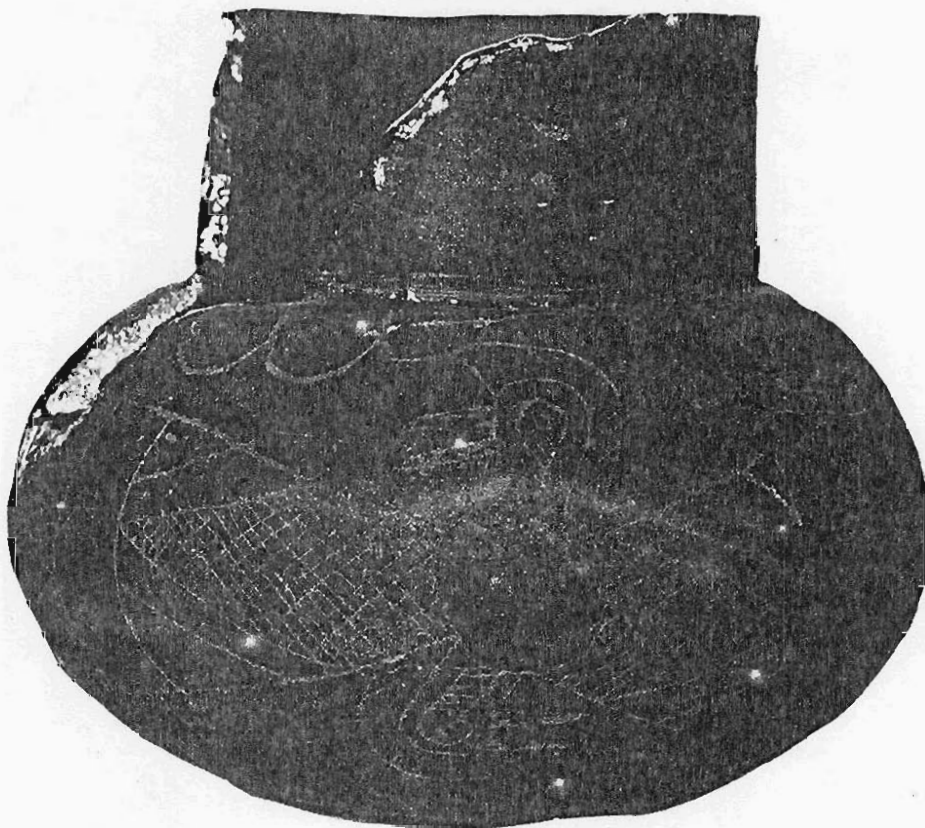


Figure IV-4. Moundville Filmed Engraved water bottle, 60NE.

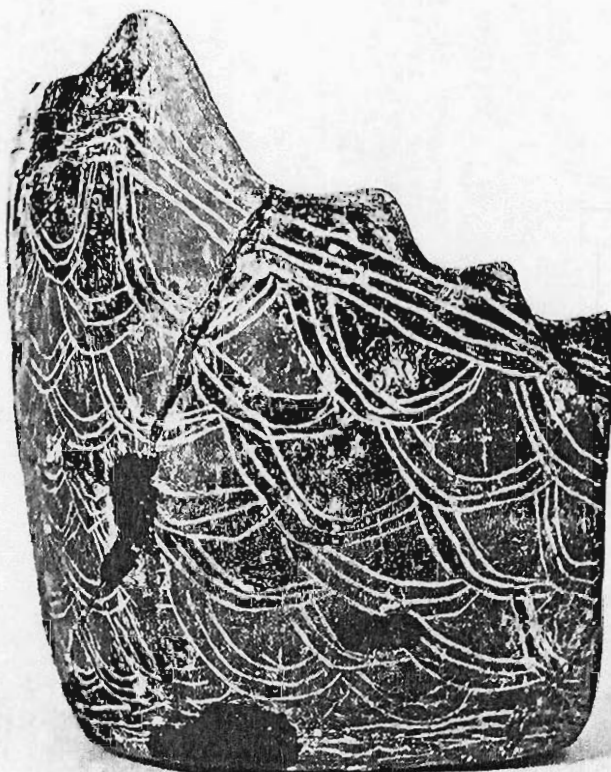


Figure IV-5. Square step-sided vessel, 67NE.

In addition to the artifacts associated with the above 19 burials a wealth of other, unassociated artifacts were recovered during the 1929-1930 excavation north of Mound E.

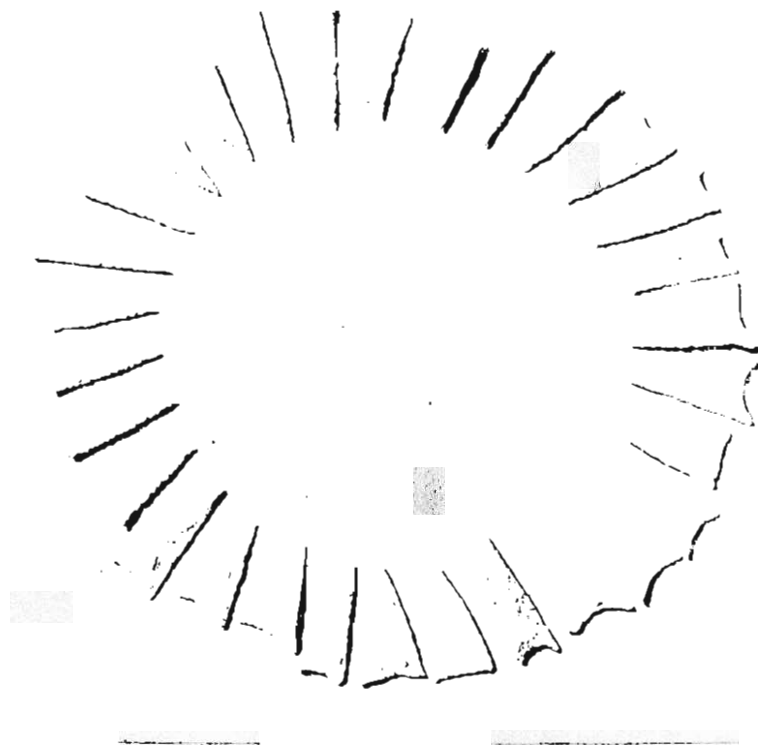


Figure IV-6. Thirty small triangular projectile points, 23NE.

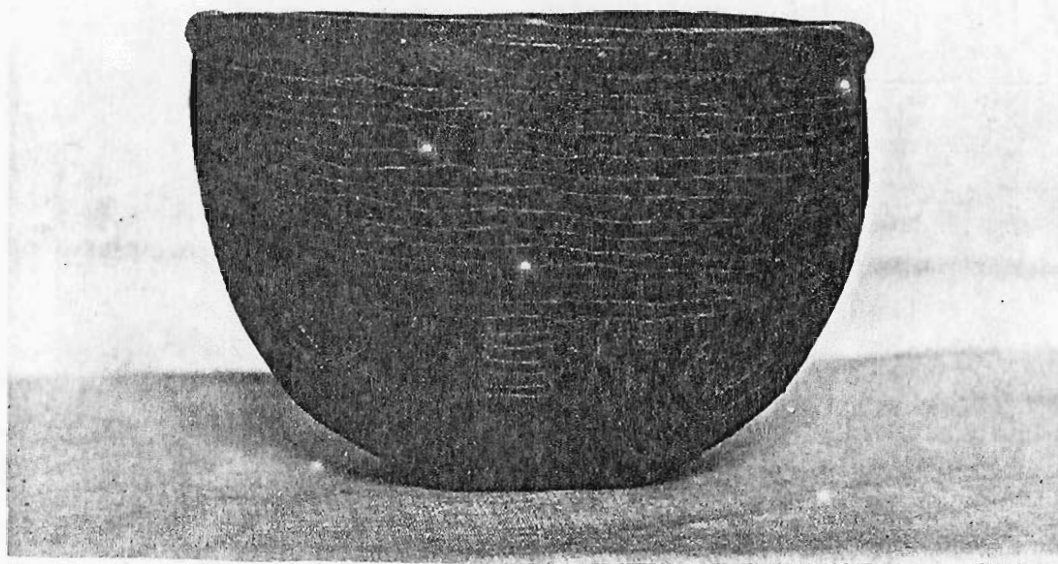


Figure IV-8. Moundville Engraved Indented bowl, 38NE.

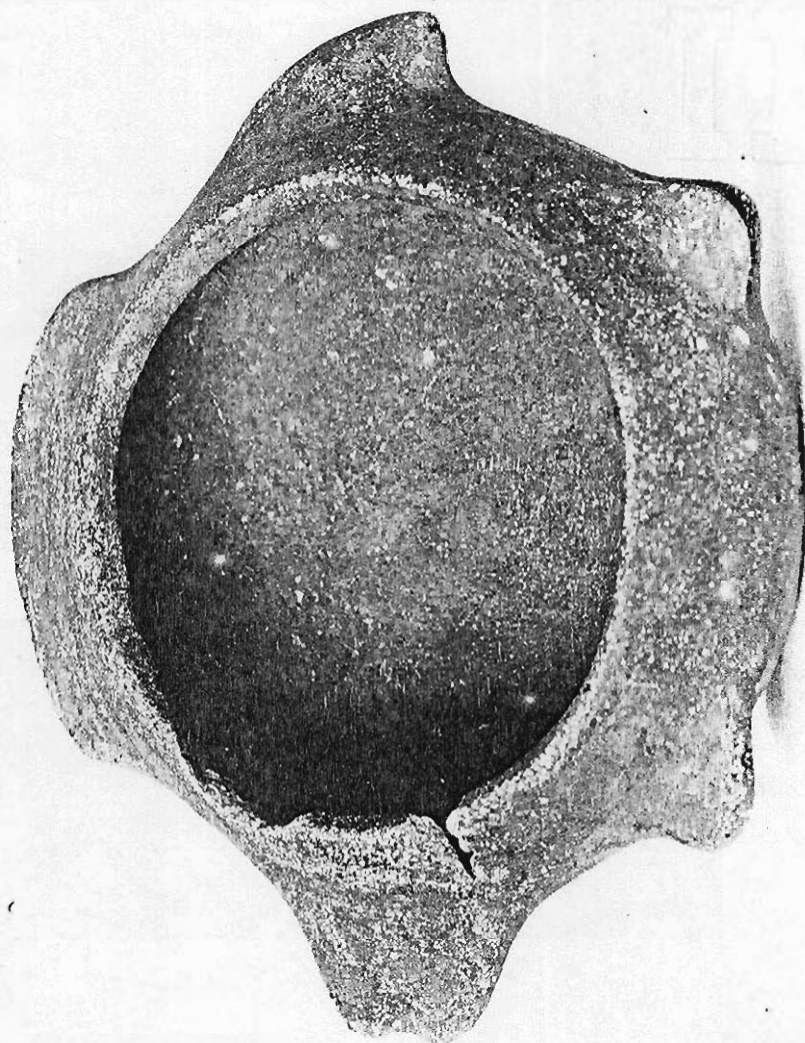


Figure IV-10. Fish effigy bowl, 4NE.

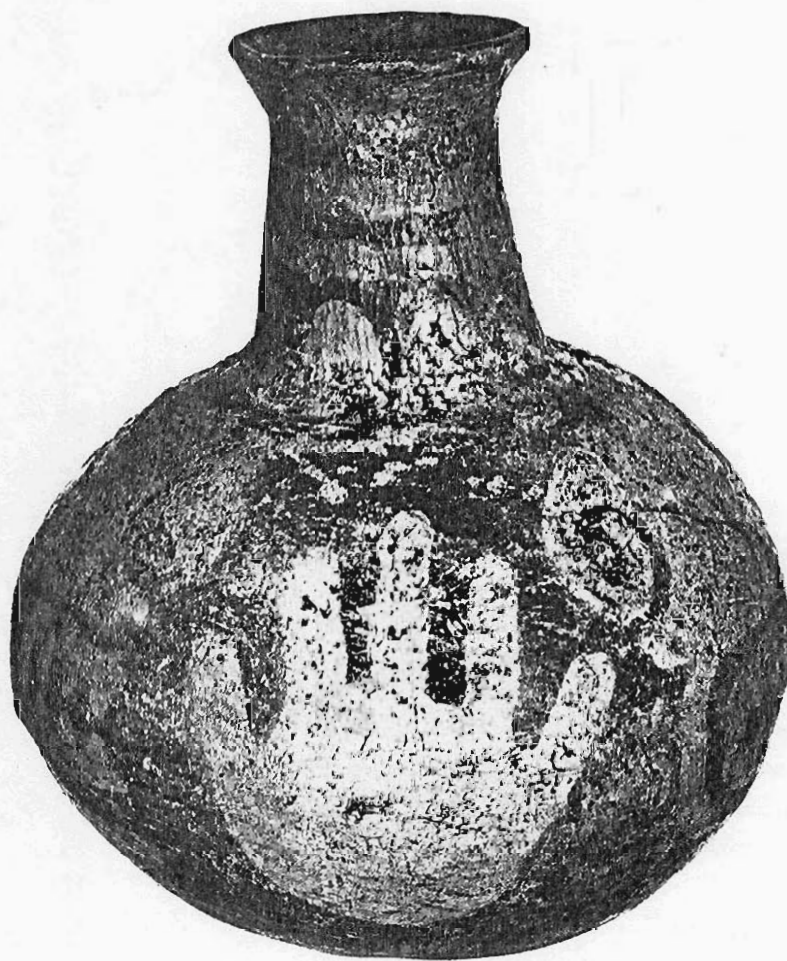


Figure IV-15. Painted water bottle, 27NE.

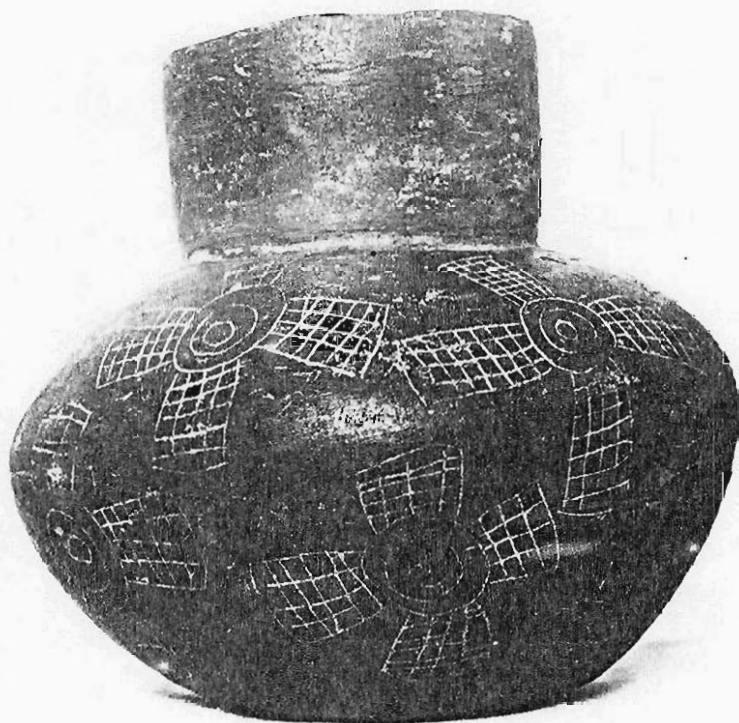


Figure IV-16. Moundville Filmed Engraved water bottle, 79NE.

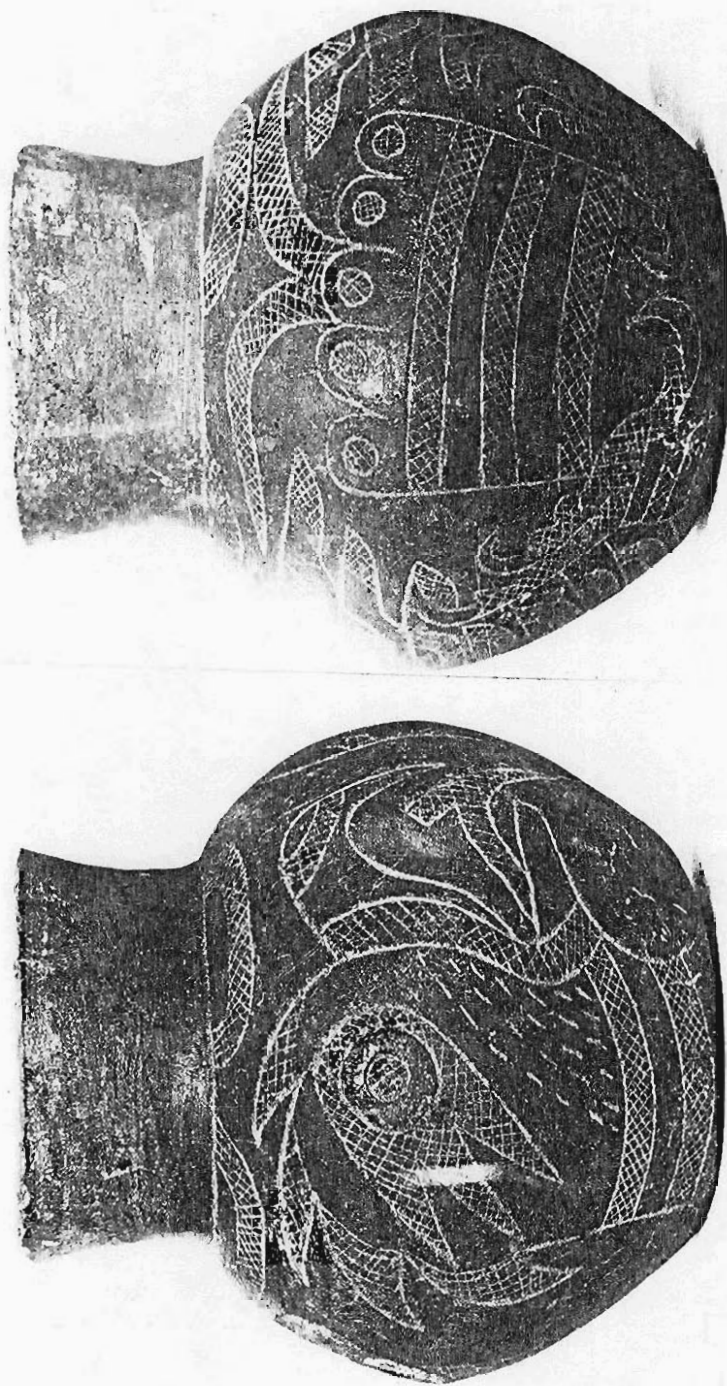


Figure IV-17. Moundville Filmed Engraved water bottle, 80NE.

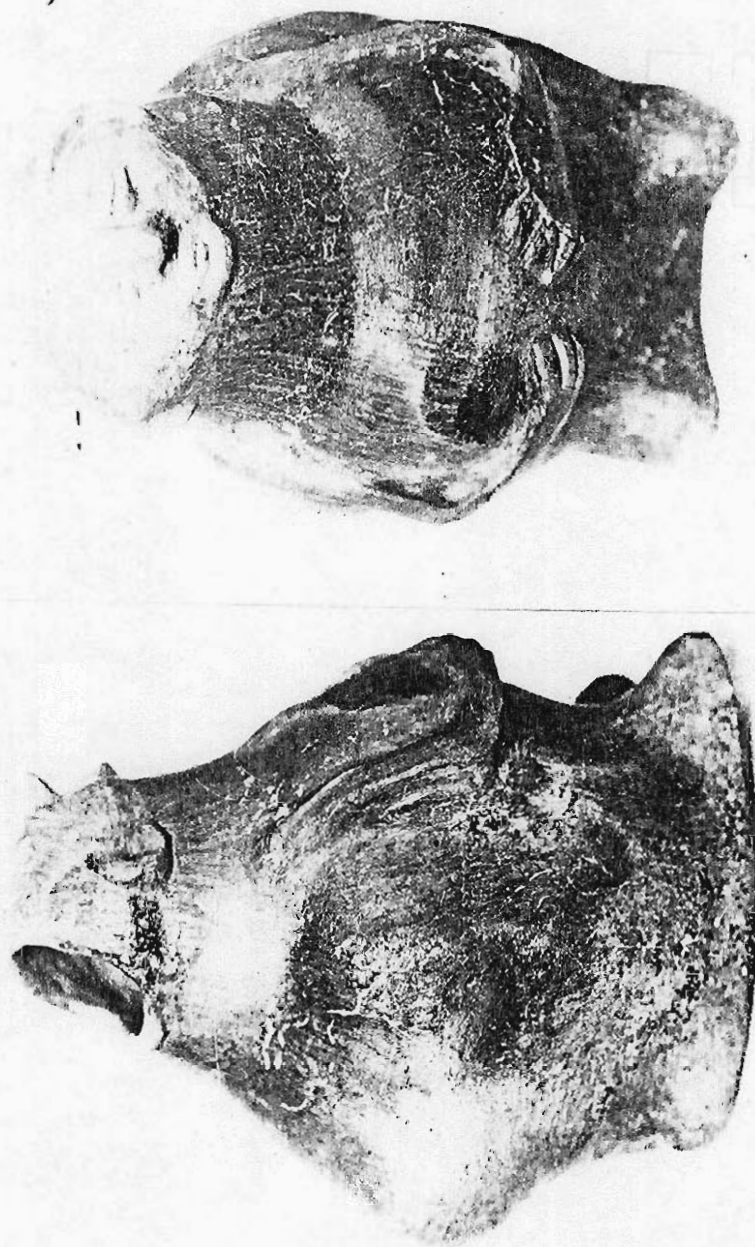


Figure IV-20. human effigy water bottle, 82NE.

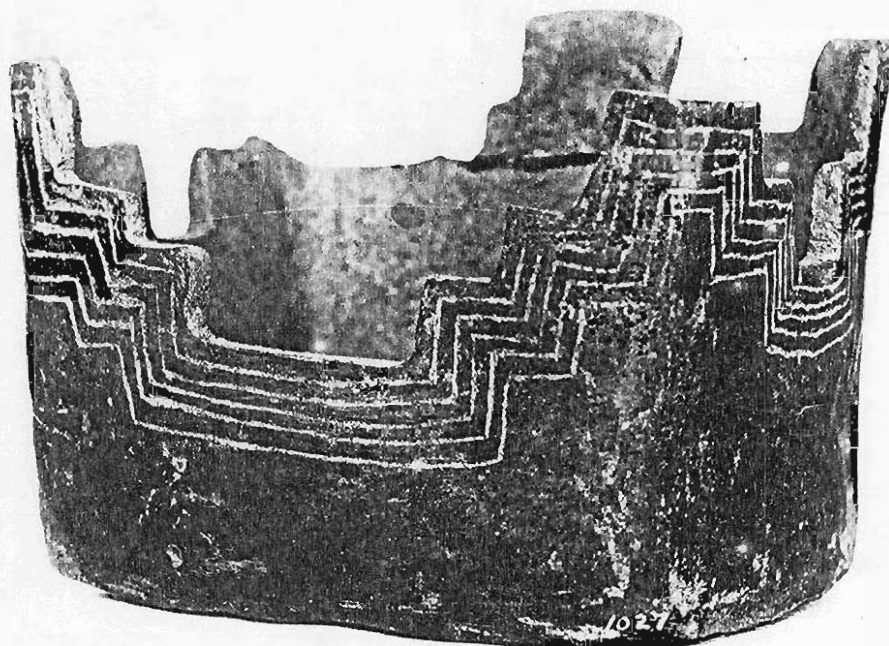


Figure IV-21. Square step-sided vessel, 1NE.

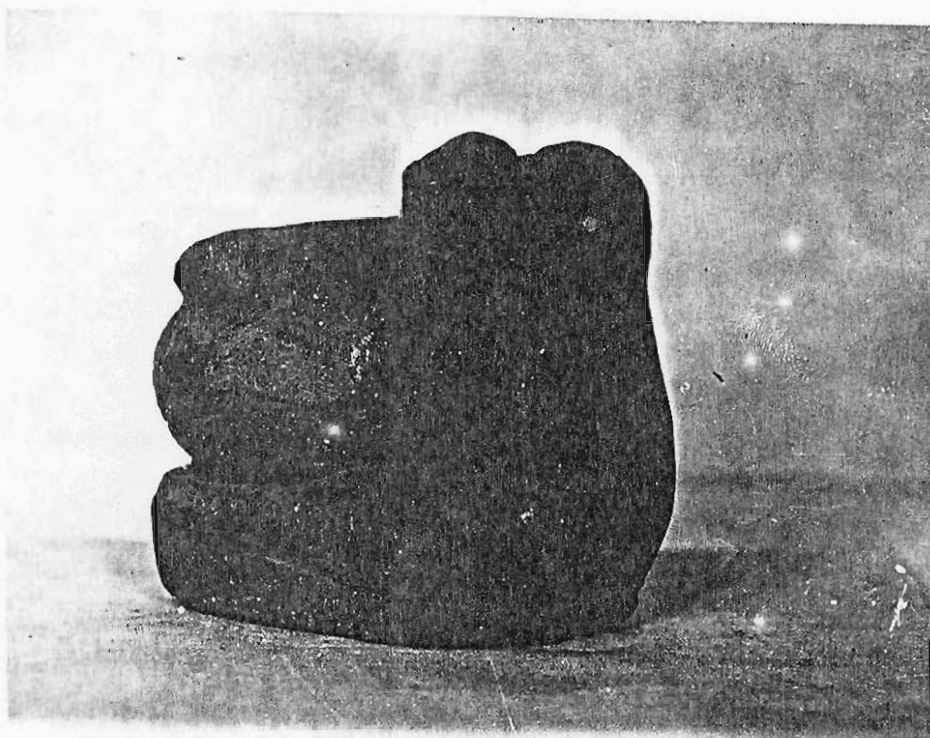


Figure IV-22. Human effigy pipe, 29NE.

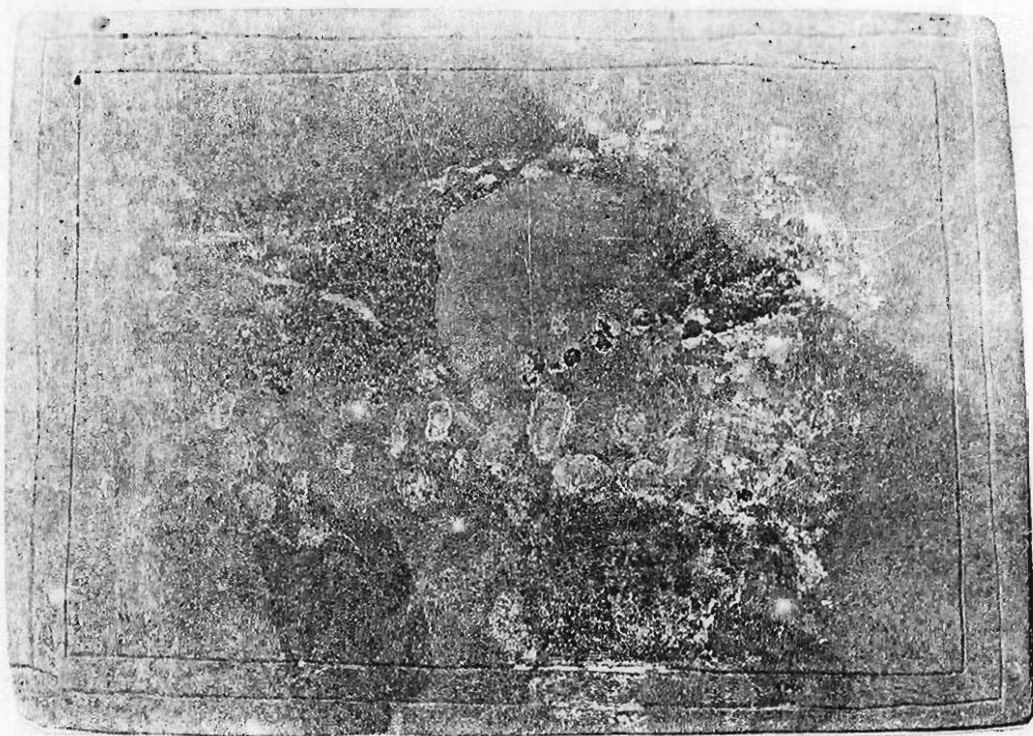


Figure IV-23. Stone palette, 7.5 inches long by 5.0 inches wide, carrying remnants of white pigment, 137NE.

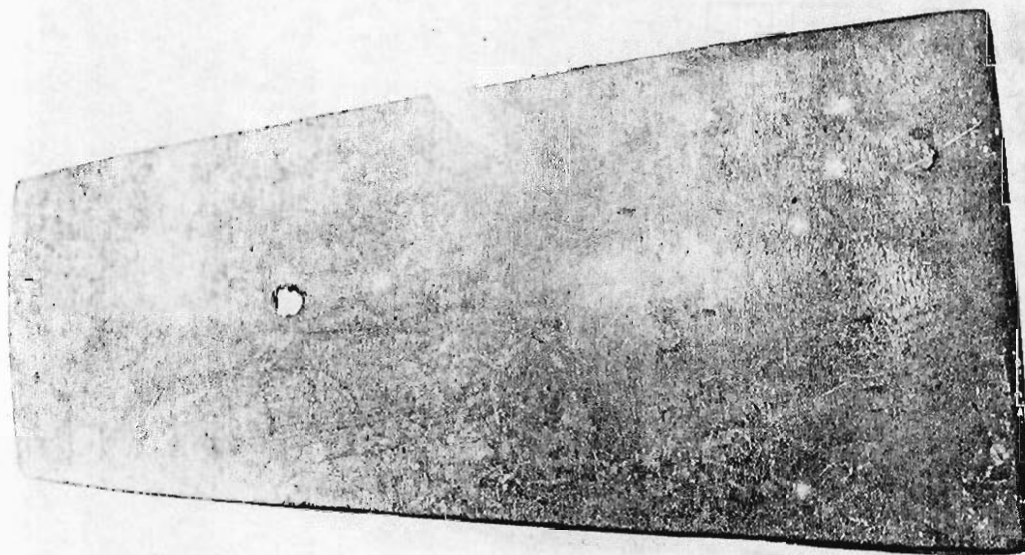


Figure IV-24. Greenstone ceremonial axe 8.75 inches long, 87NE.

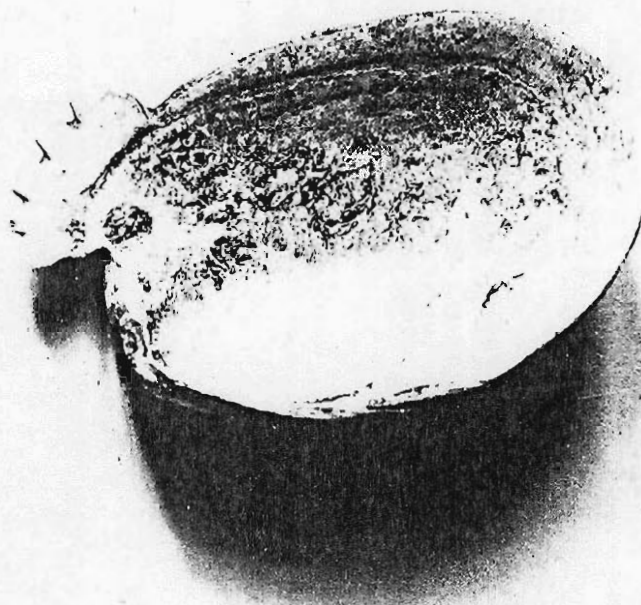


Figure IV-25. Shell spoon with one edge worked to represent fingers, 10NE.

During January and February 1932 the Alabama Museum of Natural History excavated a large block of land between Mound E and the 1929-1930 excavations north of Mound E. This excavation was designated "Excavated January 1932" on the field map and this designation has been carried forward to figure IV-2. The field notes, however, show that this area was excavated in both January and February 1932. Additionally, in March 1932, two trenches and another strip of land between Mound E and the January 1932 excavation were excavated. The burials from these areas were plotted on the field map and are shown on figure IV-2.

Burials from all the 1932 excavations north of Mound E were recorded completely and numbered in accordance with the unified numbering system for the site. The artifacts, both associated and unassociated with the burials, were numbered from where the 1929-1930 excavation left off, with 165NE.

The unassociated artifacts from all the 1932 excavations are presented in Table IV-2. Four of these unassociated artifacts, however, deserve more detailed treatment than that given in Table IV-2. Artifact 712NE was a bone awl encased in a larger bone awl which served

as a handle for the first. A hollowed-out bone (234NE0 and an incised bone (235NE), which are lumped together under "Misc. Worked Bone" in Table IV-2, were also recovered. Other than these four artifacts the descriptions in Table IV-2 closely follow the descriptive categories in the field notes.

The burials which were recovered from the 1932 excavations north of Mound E are presented below. All but burials 1663 to 1676 came from the January 1932 excavation. The remainder came from the March 1932 excavations. The locations of most of these 14 burials are shown in figure IV-2.

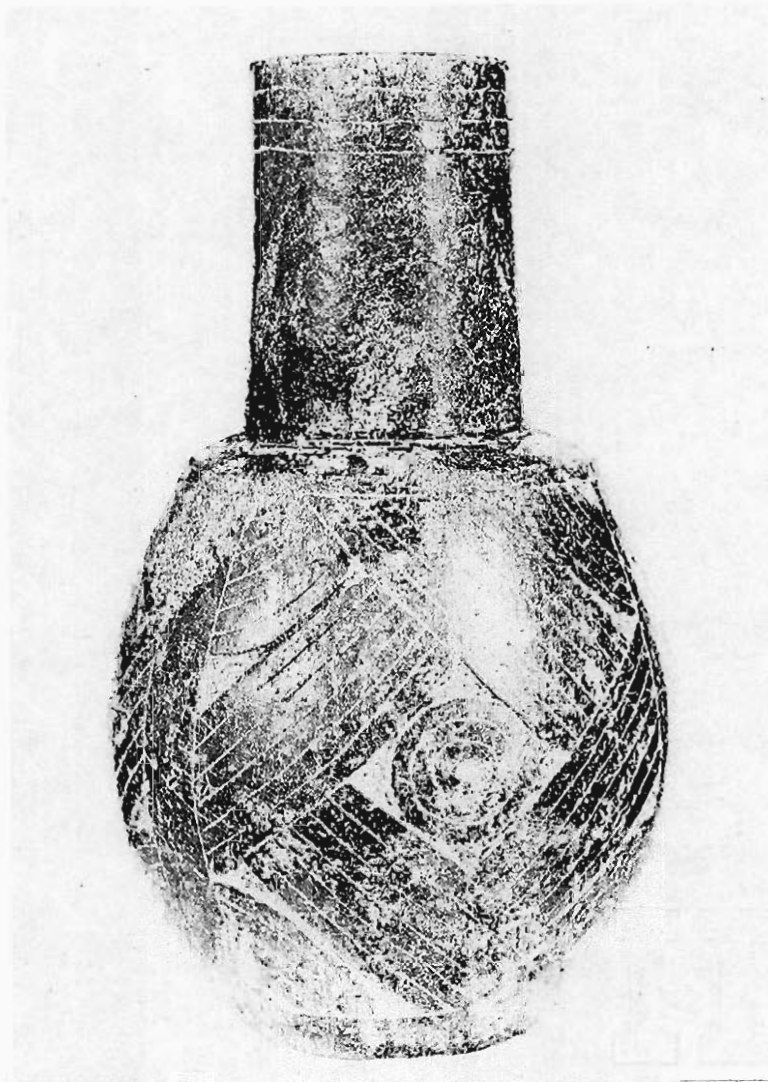


Figure IV-26. Moundville Filmed Engraved water bottle, 170NE.

Excavations East of Mound E.

The Alabama Museum of Natural History conducted two major excavations east of Mound E. During December, 1931 and January 1932 an area of approximately 9,000 square feet was excavated. This area lay between the mound and the ravine east of the mound. During March, 1932 twelve trenches were excavated to test the entire area east and southeast of the mound. Figure IV-28 details the locations of these excavations. The large area excavated near the ravine produced numerous archaeological features and artifacts; the trenches produced only a few burials and a very few artifacts.

Table IV-3 lists the unassociated artifacts from east of Mound E by major "functional" class, their counts, and their catalogue numbers. All these artifacts, except those numbered 496EE to 508EE, came from the December 1931 - January 1932 excavation. The artifacts numbered 496EE to 508EE came from the trenches excavated during March, 1932.

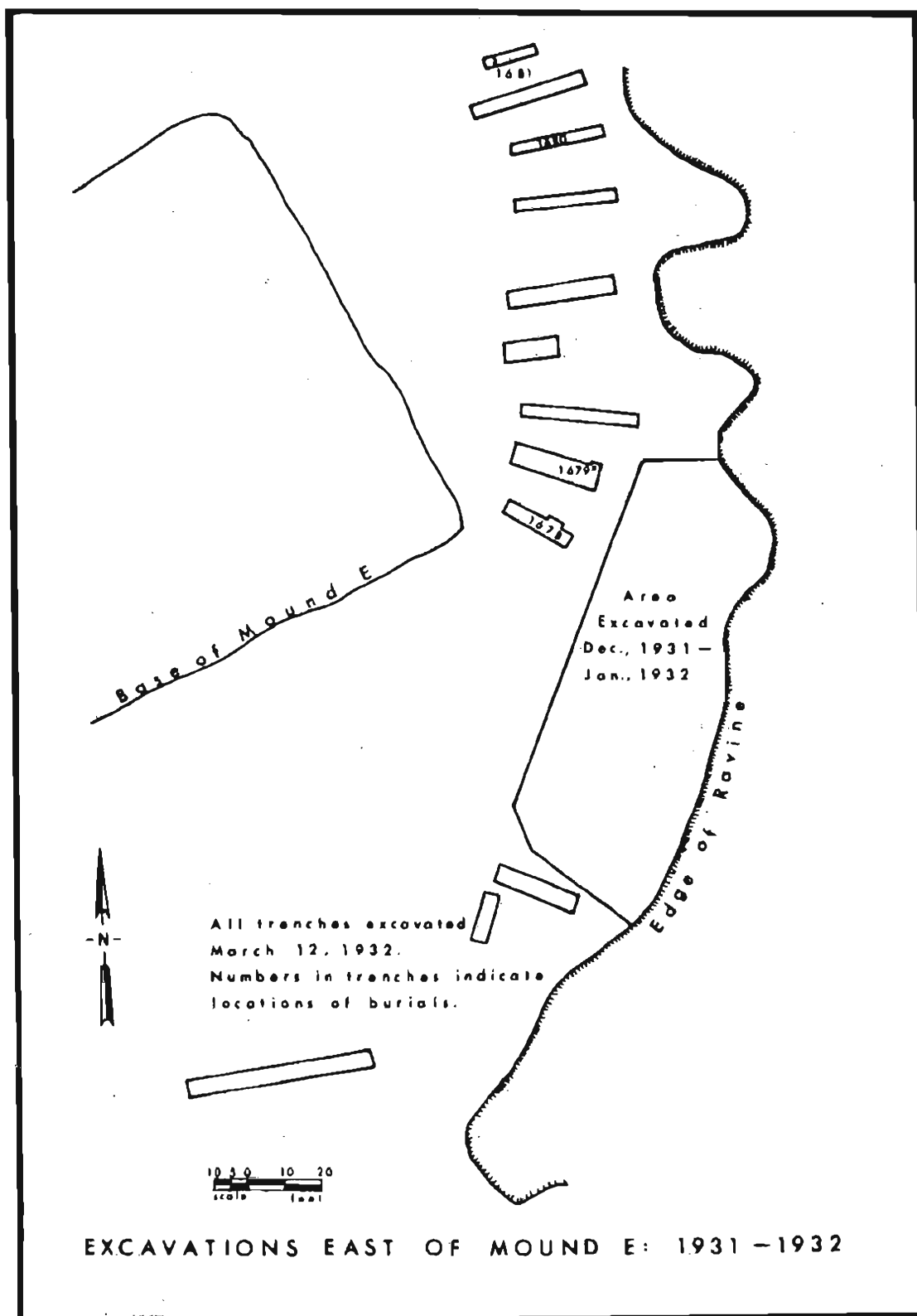


Figure IV-28. Plan of excavation east of Mound E.

The December, 1931 to January, 1932 excavation yielded one firebasin. This firebasin, which was located between burials EE1248 and EE1249, had a diameter of 20 inches, a depth of 3 inches, and was found 24 inches below the surface. Some unidentified burned material and some very fine-grained charcoal was found in this firebasin.

Burials constituted the major class of archaeological features recovered east of Mound E. One hundred and sixteen burials were excavated during December 1931 and January 1932. No field map was made to record the location of these burials. Five burials were found during the March 1932 excavation and the locations of these burials are shown in figure IV-28. Although all the burials found east of Mound E will be described in detail below, several of the multiple burials from that area should be partially described at this point.

Burials EE1233 to EE1237 and EE1245 to EE1247 represented a multiple interment of eight adult skeletons. Burials EE1234, EE1235, and EE1236 were a jumbled mass of richly accompanied skeletons at the feet of burial EE1233. Burial EE1233, an adult skeleton, was unaccompanied by grave goods. Burials EE1237, EE1245, EE1246, and EE1247 were also part of the multiple interment. However, their respective positions in the mass burial went unrecorded.

Burials EE1324 to EE1328 also constituted a multiple burial. A richly accompanied adult skeleton (EE1326) was jumbled together with another, unaccompanied, adult skeleton and the unaccompanied skeleton of a child (EE1328). Associated with these three skeletons was the skeleton of another child, (EE1325). This latter child's skeleton was accompanied by a greenstone axe. Another adult skeleton, EE1324, may have been associated with this multiple burial. All the skeletons in this interment were disturbed by later aboriginal activity.

Burials EE1322 to EE1340, EE1341, EE1343, EE1344, EE1345 and EE1346 represented the most complex multiple interment found east of Mound E. A central burial (EE1322), whose grave furnishings included two copper ear plugs, a bear canine, and three shell gorgets, was surrounded by a mass burial of eight adults, one child, and two infants. The eight adults (EE1333 to EE1340) were a tightly packed mass of skeletons. Each of these skeletons had shell beads at the ankles and the mass of burials as a whole contained a number of other artifacts. Two infants (EE1345 and EE1346), each of which had strings of beads as grave goods, were associated with the main mass of burials, as was the skeleton of a child, EE1341. Another child (EE1344) and an infant (EE1343) were found on flat ground at the edge of the pit containing the other skeletons.

Another large multiple burial contained skeletons EE1349 to EE1357, EE1358, EE1367 to EE1369, EE1371, EE1372 and EE1380. The central burial in this group was EE1358; it consisted of an adult skeleton with two ear plugs as grave goods. This central burial was surrounded by nine tightly packed, unaccompanied adult skeletons, (EE1349 to EE1357). Below the mass of skeletons was the skeleton of burial EE1380; near the main mass of skeletons were three unaccompanied adult skeletons, (EE1367 to EE1369). Two skeletons of children (EE1371 and EE1372) were found placed near the main mass of skeletons.

Only the major multiple burials have been summarized here. Both these multiple burials and all the other burials recovered from east of Mound E are described below.

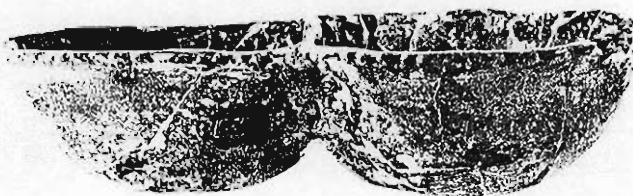
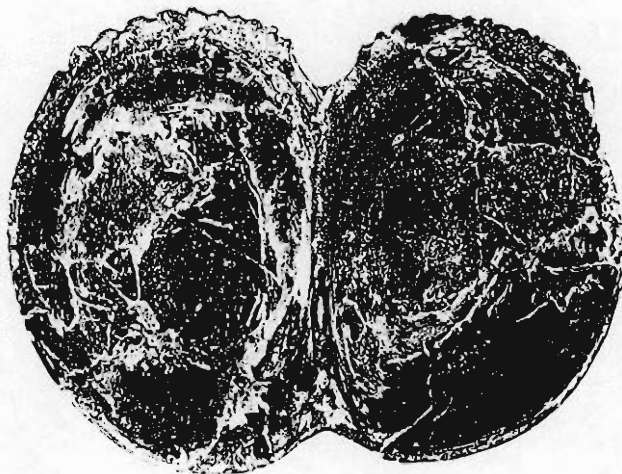


Figure IV-29. Moundville Black Filmed shell effigy vessel, 82NE.
